The Rustic Market is located at 389 68th Street SE (corner of 68th Street & Madison). Its home is the beautiful red barn, which is part of a farm that Pine Rest operated from 1913 to 1958. During that time, Pine Rest raised crops, pigs, and had a dairy herd.

In 1971, the barn was converted into the Rustic Market Thrift Store. Since that time, the Rustic Market has generated over \$1.5 million for the Pine Rest Patient Assistance Fund. This fund provides financial assistance to individuals, children, and families in the community who need mental health care, but have little or no financial resources to cover the cost. The Pine Rest Foundation will raise \$1.2 million for Patient Assistance this year. The Rustic Market will play an integral role in reaching that goal!
